
BULLETIN ADVERTISING

TRUSTEE CORNER

Renovations are down to the wire. With the move to our beautiful new bar, The 389 Room, we are limiting bottle storage to one bottle per member. Please see the bartender to pick up your surplus bottles.

The new lockers are in place. Contact the Lodge Secretary, Nancy Guthrie, for your locker assignment, currently planning to transfer lockers numbers from old lockers to new lockers, or to rent a locker if you don't

AMERICAN LEGION LEGACY RIDE

On August 16, 2025, the American Legion Fun Run will stop at Charlottesville Elks 389 around 11:00 AM. They will stop to rest, relax and eat lunch. There will be approximately 200 motorcycles involved with this first segment of the Ride and approximately 250 riders. The purpose of the ride is to raise money for Veteran's Children Foundation. The Ride will leave the lodge around 2:00 PM and head to South Boston, Virginia, where the ride will become the American Legion Legacy Ride. Upon departure on August 17, 2025, they will pick up more riders in the event. They will leave South Boston with approximately 500 motorcycles in attendance and will proceed to Tampa, Florida.

Anyone interested in being a part of FUN RUN Ride, there is a \$25.00 entry fee per person to participate from Springfield to South Boston.

The second leg of the ride, from South Boston to Tampa, is the American Legion Legacy Ride and there is another entry fee, you may go to legion.org/riders for further information. You do not have to be a member of the American Legion to participate. The Ride is set up that you may ride a certain distance and return to your home or proceed to Florida, totally your choice.
